

Pattern Notes



Tension

13 sts x 15 rows worked in dc to measure 10x10cm using 6mm crochet hook, or hook required to meet stated tension.

Tension for each stitch will be noted at the start of each patch.

Measurement

Approx 120cm x 120cm (47in x 47in)

Materials

Knitcraft Everyday Chunky
(100% Acrylic; 100g/150m)

White x 8 balls

Soft Green x 3 balls

Pink x 3 balls

Magenta x 3 balls

Denim Saxe x 2 balls

Green x 1 ball

Orange x 1 ball

Grey x 1 ball

6mm hook

Yarn needle

Scissors

Tape measure

Stitch Markers



Abbreviations (UK terms)

beg beginning

ch(s) chain(s)

ch-sp(s) chain space(s)

dc double crochet

lp(s) loop(s)

rnd(s) round(s)

RS right side

ss slip stitch

st(s) stitch(es)

htr half treble crochet

tr treble crochet

WS wrong side

yo yarn over

() repeat instructions in round brackets

Special Stitches

Berry stitch (made on WS of work)

Yo, insert hook into st, yo, pull through, yo, pull through 1 lp, yo, insert hook into same st, yo, pull through, yo, pull through all 5 loops on hook.

Bobble stitch (made on WS of work)

(Yo, insert hook into st, yo, pull through, yo, pull through 2 lps) four times in same st, yo pull through all 5 loops on hook.

3-ch picot

Work prev st as directed, 3ch, ss in front loop of prev st, continue working pattern as directed (nb. the 3-ch picot sits above a stitch rather than counting as a st itself).

Puff stitch

(Yo, insert hook into st, yo, pull through) four times in same st, yo, pull through first 8 lps on hook, yo, pull through last two lps on hook.

Dtr2tog (double treble two together)

This is not used as a decrease. Several dtr2tog are worked in one st to form a flower head.

*Yo twice, insert hook into st, yo, pull through, (yo, pull through 2 lps) twice; rep from * once more, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook.

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Pattern Notes

The blanket is made up of 10cmx10cm, 10cmx20cm, 20cmx20cm, 30cmx30cm and 20cmx40cm patches, which are joined on completion.

Please make sure you are working to the correct tension as this will affect how your patches will fit together. We recommend checking your tension for each new stitch to make sure your patch will come out to the correct size.

Designs can be worked up in alternative colours to those listed in the pattern however this will affect yarn quantities set out above.

With the exception of the 10x10cm Granny Square Patches, all patches have a dc border. Please note this when considering the tension.

We recommend blocking after each week so you are ready to join in week 7.

Tapestry Crochet

Tapestry crochet enables colourful patterns to be made within your crochet work. When working tapestry crochet patches and all other patches which use multiple colours in the same row, colour changes are made in the last yo of the previous st. The yarn colours not currently being worked can be carried within the sts, as sts are worked over the top OR they can be left on the WS of the work to be picked up in the following row, as directed.

Gently pull the non-active yarns before changing colour to ensure that all yarns lay flat within the work.

To prevent work from becoming too bulky, not all yarn colours are carried across the row. When the last st has been made with that colour for that specific motif or in that specific row, leave yarn on the WS of the work to be picked up again in the following row. It may be necessary to join multiple separate yarn balls to assist with this, as set out within the pattern.

Some patches are worked from the tapestry crochet charts. When working from charts, odd number rows (RS) are worked from right to left and even number rows (WS) are worked from left to right.
